5. Parents and godparents who present a child for baptism are making promises on that child's behalf. They should be ready and willing to give the child a Christian upbringing within the family of the Church to the best of their ability, endeavouring to be a role model in faith not only by their teaching but also by their example and their prayers. Please therefore consider carefully the suitability of individuals who may wish to act as godparents.

Because of these responsibilities, it is not permissible for individuals who have not been baptised themselves to act as godparents. They can however act as a 'sponsor', with a similar role and function during the baptism service.

6. Church guidelines suggests **three** godparents, two of the same sex as the child and one of the opposite sex, but to have one godfather and one godmother is sufficient (there must be at least one of each sex).

Parents may be godparents to their own children, provided that the child has at least one other godparent.

7. This question is not a test! There is no 'right' answer. The minister will however want to have a brief conversation with you about your reasons for seeking baptism for your child, and to answer any questions you may have about baptism and its role as a rite of initiation into the Christian faith.
